

CORONER'S POSITION

LAKE COUNTY is currently seeking a candidate for appointment of a part-time Coroner. The appointment will continue until January 6, 2019.

COMPENSATION: Fees and expenses as set by the Board of County Commissioners.

CLOSING DATE: 5:00 p.m. on Monday, June 19, 2017

GENERAL INFORMATION: Appointee would need to run in the general election on November 6, 2018 for a new two-year term that begins on January 7, 2019, and win in order to continue in this position. Appointee will serve as the County Coroner as detailed under South Dakota Codified Law, including but not limited to Chapters 7-14 and 23-14. Applicant will be required to participate in the training program established by the Law Enforcement Officers Standards Commission within one year of appointment.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES INCLUDE:

- Investigates unattended and traumatic deaths, as well as any human death if a determination of the cause and manner of death is in the public interest, that happen within the confines of Lake County
- Examine bodies and circumstances surrounding death
- Hold an inquest and inquire into the cause of death of such persons only as are supposed to have died by unlawful means
- Provide for the delivery of the body of any deceased person which they are called upon to view to the person entitled to receive it
- Provide for the burial of the body of any deceased person if there is no family

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Graduation from high school or GED equivalent.
